Annual Budget 2022 / 23

he annual budget was compiled by all the Members of the Parish Council by Committee. The budget was set by the Parish Council in January 2022.

The pie chart gives a representation of the proposed spending budget for 2022/23. Adjustments will be made during the year according to the needs of the village.

# Precept 2022 / 23

nce the budget is set the annual 'Precept' or local tax amount is calculated. The Precept is calculated by a formula based on a 'Band D' household which is £25.00 for the year 2022/23. In order to continue to provide the best level of service for our residents the Parish Council decided to increase the precept on a Band D property by £3.00 from the 2021/22 level.

The graph below shows all the precept bandings set in Clayton-le-Woods for 2022/23 (A - H). The Income from the Precept for 2022/23 is £139,963.00 which is made up of £128,505.00 collected from the residents and £11,458.00 deprivation grant.

## Precept 2022 / 23

n addition to the Precept the Parish Council receives Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) funding which is monies that are received from certain new developments within the Parish.

CIL funding can be spent on any project which provides a permanent infrastructure within the local area. Applications are evaluated by the Parish Council in February and July of each year.

# The Ley Inn Or

# **Higher Wood End Farm**

estled next to the Cuerden Valley Parklands, at the very top of Back lane, set back from the road, is the quaint Ley Inn - one of the oldest historical buildings in Clayton le Woods.

According to the Enalish Dictionary, its old English name 'Ley' means a clearing in the woods



or 'a piece of land put down to grass, clover, etc., for a single season or a limited number of years, in contrast to permanent pasture'.

In years gone by, before it became an inn in the mid 1970s, it was once known as Higher Wood End Farm and happens to be opposite Lower Wood End Farm, which is now actually part of Cuerden Valley Park.

In George Bolton's book, 'Clayton in History' he mentions that in 1664 Higher Wood end farm had 1 hearth and Lower Wood End farm had 4 hearths. The more hearths you had the more tax you paid, Hearth tax or 'Chimney money' was collected from house-holders by the Parish Constable, on his long rounds on the ancient rights of way in Clayton, at one shilling per hearth twice a year - the poor being exempt if on poor relief.

Apparently the farm and land came for sale in October 1973, in the London Gazette, which makes me think it was once part of the larger Tatton estates in and around Clayton -Lower Wood End farm stayed as part of the estate and later became part of the Cuerden Valley Park Trust.

Having spent many an hour in this establishment, enjoying both the wonderful food and beverages, I would certainly recommend you visit this lovely old inn. Plus it's good that some of these older buildings in Clayton le Woods have been preserved for all to enjoy.
