Your Parish Council

Who are we?

Parish Councils are civil Local Authorities, being the lowest, or first tier of local government. Clayton-le-Woods is a large Parish within the borough of Chorley and has a long history, being established in 1894. It consists of 15 voluntary Parish Councillors who are elected for a four year term of office to serve and administer to the needs of the residents of Clayton-le-Woods village. It employs a Clerk to the Council and funding is raised by a precept on each residential property in the Parish, via your Council Tax. This allows us to carry out our duties to both improve and maintain the area in which we live.

What do we do?

The Parish Council owns a number of assets, including the Community Centre on Spring Meadow; Back Lane Woods; several Play Areas and the Skate Park near to Asda. The maintenance and improvement of these areas remains high on our agenda, as does the appearance of the area. We employ Lengths Men from Lisieux Hall to help keep the area litter-free and we maintain many of the flower beds around the Parish. Hence, we believe that Clayton is one of the prettiest and tidiest parishes in the whole of Chorley. We hope you agree!

Remembrance **Day Service** Held on Sunday 13th November **Grow to share** garden grant-aided by the Parish Council

The Parish Council financially supported the creation of a 'Grow to Share' garden outside Clayton Brook Village Hall. The grant was given for the building of four raised beds planted with a variety of fruit and vegetables; the purchase of two wheelbarrows and two cold frames and the purchase of fruit bushes. The 'Grow to Share' group have plant to encourage the community to help maintain the

newly-planted areas to provide a sustainable source of fresh fruit and vegetables for years to come.

The group also plans to train local people in food growing skills with the support of Lancashire Adult Learning College, and have drop-in sessions and skill sharing sessions from local people to encourage others to grow and share.



New Benches & Bins for Old

The Parish Council is in the process of replacing tired-looking benches and bins that are past their best. So far this year, we have replaced benches at the entrance to Cuerden Valley Park; at Back Lane opposite Swansey Garage and at Clayton

The council owns a number of bins located throughout the area and we pay Chorley Council to empty them. Over the year, we have been replacing these bins with bins that are suitable for dog waste and cigarette stubs, as well as litter. If you see any bins in need of replacement, please let the clerk know.

What are we planning to do next year?

Have your say on play area...

Plans are in hand to refurbish the play area in Clayton Brook. This was the first of a number of play areas installed by the Parish Council over 17 years ago. As it is now in need of a complete make-over, the Parish Council has budgeted for this work to be done in 2017.

Hanging Baskets to be extended

For a number of years, the Parish Council has provided hanging baskets within the parish over the summer months. Plans have been agreed to increase the numbers of baskets and to extend the locations to include Clayton Brook Road.



Planting Beds to be revamped

Next year, a number of planting beds within the parish will be revamped to provide year-round colour.


Play Week 2017

Plans are underway for Play Week 2017. Each year, the parish council sponsors a play week for the under 5's during the first week of August to give an opportunity for play, education and interaction.

The Play Week is led by the Happy House Play Group which has all the necessary Ofsted / Child Protection clearances. This play group is well known in the community for high quality care of the under 5's age group.

Spring MeadowCommunity Centre

This parish council-owned community centre, located in Spring Meadow, is home to a variety of activities, including: Happy House Play Group; Rainbows, Brownies and Guides; Kick Boxing; free-style martial arts; the Women's Institute and Clayton Christian Fellowship

A Play Week takes place in first week in August each year, subsidised by the parish council.

Community Bowling Green

CLAYTON IN BYGONE TIMES

Until the mid-1970's, the Ley Inn in Back Lane was a working farm that had been in existence since the late 1700's. It was called Higher Wood End Farm and was one of the original buildings in the village. It was the birth place of John Clayton (born 1778), a Nonconformist minister of note and pastor of the Weigh-house Chapel from 1778 to 1826. So it is a building of some historical interest, being mentioned in 'A History of the County of Lancaster: Volume 6'. (Originally published by Victoria County History, London, 1911).

Ever fancied being a parish councillor?

Well now's your chance...

Following the resignation of a serving councillor last month, there is a 'casual vacancy'. This means that the Parish Council may co-opt a resident (or someone who works in Clayton-le-Woods) to become a Parish Councillor before the next elections are due, in order that the council has the full number of councillors.

Parish Councillors work in a voluntary capacity to serve their community. As a minimum, it involves attending formal Full Parish Council meetings every month, plus attending additional Committee meetings. These meetings are held in Clayton Green Library in the evening.
